The census taker made the following notes:

The hay crop in the subdivison S-7 was unusually large in 1869. The crop of cereals was depressed by long continued wet. The crop of apples and potatoes was nearly a failure. Early freezing of apples and rot in potatoes. Rot in more than 1/3 of the usual crop of either was harvested.
